PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The board held its last meeting in the Clubhouse on October 3rd. It was held as a hybrid meeting with some board members attending via Zoom. During this meeting the ballots for new board members were counted by our Election Inspector, Diane Lehmann. Our HOA had an excellent turnout in returned ballots, with over 70 percent returned, which is exceptional for an HOA our size.

The board would like to thank Diane for assuming this role, and helping the HOA develop a structure and process for future elections. There were two officers elected: returning member, Colin Tierney; and our newest member, Lorraine Margon. The board will meet next in November to decide on board positions and responsibilities for the upcoming term year.

Everyone should have received an official communication from King Management on the changes in our HOA management. The board is working on a smooth transition to King. King has a much more robust infrastructure in place to support the owners. These systems support HOA documentation, service requests, and record keeping, among many other owner tools to support HOA life. We are looking to move as much as possible to this infrastructure to remove our reliance on our own website. Our current website is archaic and was due for a complete overhaul. It is due November 1, and you must send your November payment by mail to King Manage- ment at their Soquel address or drop it off in person. (An envelope was provided in the October 12 mailing.) It will be considered late after November 10.

I know I have to pay by check for my November HOA dues. In December and going forward, what are my payment options?

You will have several options:

- 1. by mail to an address in Vallejo, CA
- 2. via automatic deduction from your bank account
- 3. online via the new "App Folio" portal
- 4. by "bill-pay" with your bank
- 5. online directly to King Management's bank

Will I have to pay a service fee if I opt to pay automatically with a credit card?

Yes, there wil be a small fee charged by AppFolio to cover the cost of credit card processing.

I can appreciate that King Management wants to have as much of a paperless system as possible and that we save money by doing so. But, how can I get a copy of my monthly statement if they don't send it to me?

There will be a new "AppFolio" homeowner portal. Here you may access your account and obtain a copy of your monthly statement.

Where do I find this "AppFolio"?

Soon, you will receive an email from King Management with an activation link that will allow you to set up your AppFolio.

TRAVEL TIPS

Traveling out of the country?

Travel Advisories. Check with the State Department to see if they have issued any travel warnings that may affect your decision to travel to a particular destination by clicking **HERE**.

Passport. Make sure your passport has not expired nor is within 6 months of expiration. Some countries require your passport to be valid for 6 months after you travel. Also, the US Passport Office recommends that you renew your passport approximately nine months before it expires.

Need to check luggage?

Make sure you understand **weight limits and fees** for checked baggage by checking the airline's website. If you have frequent flyer status with an airline, this may entitle you to a certain amount of free baggage. And, take a photo of the the interior and exterior of your luggage in case its becomes lost.

Want to keep track of your luggage?

Many airlines have an app that will track your luggage. If that is not available, you may want to consider inserting **Apple Air Tags** or **Tile** bluetooth trackers. These are digital devices that work with an app on your phone so you can track your luggage. Not only do these devices work with your luggage, but you can use them for anything you need to keep track of.

Lost luggage?

If you can't carry on your luggage, there's always a risk that your luggage may be lost. And recently, a huge amount of luggage has been lost or delayed due to staffing problems within the airline industry. Some people make an artform of being able to pack everything into a carry-on and a backpack; but that can be hard to do, depending on your what your needs may be.

If your luggage is lost, go to the airline's desk in the baggage handling area and file a

report. To do so, you will want to have your checked luggage stickers along with a description of your luggage--brand, size, color, style. If you might not remember all of this information about your luggage, it would be wise to write it down in a "notes" file on your phone or even in your "contacts," filed under "luggage."

U.S. regulations state that airlines must compensate passengers for lost, delayed or damaged luggage, up to a specified limit.

If your bag is declared lost, the airline must compensate you for the bag's contents, subject to depreciation, up to a preset maximum of \$3,800 for domestic flights and about \$1,800

for international flights. The carrier must also refund any fees paid for checking the bag. Airlines are also responsible for up to another \$20,000 for a lost or damaged "assistive device" for a traveler's disability, in-



cluding crutches, walkers, wheelchairs, hearing aids or prosthetics, for example.

If your bag is delayed: Those maximum liability limits also apply to delayed bags. Payment to a traveler may include out-of-pocket costs for additional clothing or other purchases that the traveler makes out of necessity due to the delay. Ask the baggage agent what the airline will reimburse. Things like a change of clothing, a toothbrush, toothpaste and deodorant are usually considered "reasonable" purchases.



Hang in there!

Most of all, stay calm. Traveling is stressful enough on its own, and most of it is out of our hands. Try to hang in there so you can enjoy your trip, especially if it's

RECIPE CORNER Crusty Baked Potatoes with Whipped Feta

Potatoes (Serves 4)

- 1 tablespoon chopped fresh rosemary
- 2 teaspoons fresh thyme leaves
- Grated zest of 1 large lemon
- 1 tablespoon coarse sea salt
- 4 large (8- to 10-oz.) Idaho baking potatoes
- Good olive oil
- Whipped feta (see recipe below)
- Chopped fresh chives

- 1. Preheat the oven to 400 degrees. Line a sheet pan with aluminum foil.
- 2. Place the rosemary, thyme, lemon zest, and sea salt in the bowl of a mini food processor and pulse 10 to 12 times, until finely chopped but not puréed. Spread the mixture in a shallow bowl or plate.
- 3. Scrub the potatoes, dry them well, and pierce them all over with the tines of a fork. Place the potatoes on the prepared sheet pan and rub them all over with olive oil. Roll each potato in the salt and herb mixture and put them back on the sheet pan. Bake for 60 to 75 minutes, until tender. Slit the top of each potato, squeeze the ends together to open the potato, and top with a generous scoop of whipped feta. Sprinkle with chives and serve hot with extra whipped feta on the side.

Whipped Feta (Serves 4)

- 6 oz. Greek feta, crumbled
- 2 oz. cream cheese, at room temperature
- ⅓ cup good olive oil
- 2 tablespoons freshly squeezed lemon juice
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper

Place the feta and cream cheese in the bowl of a food processor fitted with the steel blade and pulse until the cheeses are mixed. Add the olive oil, lemon juice, ½ teaspoon salt, and ¼ teaspoon pepper and process until smooth.
