The pool and spa were opened in late March. We are still working out the reopening under the current county COVID guidelines. This process will continue to evolve as the county modifies restrictions on public space and capacity. We are also looking at the COVID safety requirements for a reopening of the clubhouse in the very near future.

The election of the HOA's board of directors is in process. The recent California State Senate Bill 323 governs this process, which we began in February. We anticipate concluding the process in late-June or early-July. If you have questions, please feel free to contact Anderson & Company for further explanation.

I want to encourage owners to participate in our monthly board meetings and bring forward any, and all, concerns. It should be noted that the board is only legally allowed to work off of the pre-published agenda. While new topics and items can be brought forward during the meeting, the board is restricted on action until the following month. Owners should bring concerns forward in sufficient time before our meetings such that they can be added to the agenda for the upcoming meeting.

Finally, I want to make sure that all of you are aware that this newsletter is available via email. In a continued effort to expand our "green efforts," we ask that you consider switching to email receipt of the newsletter. POOL AND SPA 9AM-10PM

The pool and spa reopened on March 31 with several rules and guidelines, which were sent to all owners and are posted outside of the pool. COVID restrictions are in place.

Here's a brief summary of those rules and guidelines:

- Use of the pool and spa are by reservation only by using the sign-up sheets posted outside of the pool.
- Reserved use is for owners, renters and their invited guests who are currently within the same social distancing "bubble."
- ☐ Reservations for the pool are in one-hour increments, limited to 12 people.
- Use of the spa is in half-hour increments, limited to 6 people.
- PLEASE cancel any reservation that you do not plan to use so others may enjoy these facilities.

Considerations for pool and spa use:

Regarding the pool. . .

- Think about scheduling your weekday time before 1 pm and after 5 pm to allow families with school-age children to use the pool on weekdays and also to provide opportunities for those who can utilize the pool only at that time.
- Might it be possible to limit your use to a maximum of three days per week during these hours? That would provide more opportunities for others.

Watch the time, and please depart before the next group's start time.

For pool and spa. . .

- Spray sanitizer is on site and should be applied to any surfaces you use (pool handrails, furniture and restroom surfaces) before you leave the facilities.
- Please adhere to all posted rules within the pool area.
