During the March board meeting, it was decided to reopen the pool along with the spa once the county returned to the Red Tier. We have begun heating the pool, which should have it operational and open for use during the last week of March. We will once again be using an advance reservation format to meet the necessary county guidelines of public pool and/or spa operation. A web-based reservation system is being considered to help ease the process. More information will be sent out once the system is in place and ready for use.



TREE MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR CANON DEL SOL PROPERTY

a plan for
tree man-



agement within the Canon Del Sol property. This is an ongoing plan and has involved hands-on review, a quote process and much research and discussion.

The priority items are identified with the help of tree experts and a focus on safety first. The plan includes removing dead trees, cutting back trees that may cause property damage or detract from property values.

All of the tree work will be performed by a licensed contractor and will begin at a date yet to be determined. The contractor will be following the specific, long-term plan as laid out by the Board and cannot deviate from this plan without Board approval.

If any Owner has specific concerns or would like to pay out of pocket for individual tree management, please contact Bob Carpenter.

RECIPE CORNER

Easy Meatball Recipe

35 minutes to prep and cook

Servings: 5

Calories per serving: 184

Ingredients

- 1 pound 80% lean ground beef (could sub with half ground pork)
- 1 large egg (beaten)
- 1/4 cup breadcrumbs
- 1/4 cupgrated parmesan cheese
- 1/4 cup finely chopped onion
- 2 teaspoons minced garlic
- 3/4 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/4 teaspoon black pepper
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh Italian flat leaf parsley (optional)

Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 400°F. Line a baking sheet with foil and spray with non-stick spray.
- Combine the meat, egg, breadcrumbs, cheese, salt, garlic, onion, black pepper and parsley in a bowl. Stir just until combined; do not over mix. Add a tablespoon or two of water as needed to keep a wet mixture.
- 3. Use a medium cookie scoop or spoon to scoop the meat. Then form into 1 1/2" balls and place on the pan.
- Bake uncovered for 17-20 minutes, or until no longer pink in the middle. Turn halfway through so the bottoms don't brown.
- 5. Simmer meatballs with marinara sauce for 10 minutes and serve over noodles if desired.

Notes

How to fry meatballs

You can also cook in a pan with 2 tablespoons oil over medium-high heat for 7-10 minutes, or until cooked through.

Substitutions

You can use 1/2 teaspoon each of garlic powder and onion powder if you do not have fresh garlic or onions.




HISTORY OF THE LA SELVA BEACH LIBRARY


The La Selva Beach (LSB) Branch is the second library in the Santa Cruz Public Library system to complete construction from Measure S funds. The Branch was completely renovated, maintaining its original footprint of 2,200 square feet. Renovations include: replacements of single pane windows and doors, a new heating/ventilation system, an ADA compliant restroom, all new furniture and fixtures, and a new front entrance. Thanks to a generous matching grant of \$100,000 from the Monterey Peninsula Foundation, the library patio was upgraded with furniture and a pergola to expand outdoor programming. The Friends of the La Selva Beach Branch Library raised additional funds for interior folding glass partitions to enhance the flexibility of space usage for different types of programs for adults and children, as well as sound abatement.

The LSB library began in 1950 with the LSB Woman's Club circulating books from a closet in the Clubhouse. By 1960, the makeshift library had issued membership cards to 199 adults and 108 youth. In 1968, an arrangement was made for a "real" library to open at its current location with the building to be owned by the LSB Recreation District and leased to the library. After Proposition 13, the library was closed briefly, but then reopened due to the dedication of volunteers who were the sole staffers for the next eight years. In 1996, a 600 square foot addition provided for a children's area and a staff room.

Thanks to wonderful staff and a full calendar of programs for both children and adults, the library has functioned as a hub for community gathering and learning in La Selva Beach.
