PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As we're wrapping up the year, we focused the November board meeting on next year's plans and our future reserve funding needs. The operating and reserve budget for 2021 was reviewed and approved. The 2021 budget includes a significant increase in spending for tree maintenance and landscaping. We also will begin a clean-up effort of the perimeter of the property on the state park side of the fence. This will include the removal and cleanup of trees, bushes and debris. We hope to begin some of this work in the next sixty days.

SWIMMING POOL IS OPEN BY SIGN-UP

The pool is open, but you must reserve your time slot (due to Covid-19). Sign up on the sheet next to the pool and reserve on an hourly basis.

- Owners...have you provided the Temporary Pool Rules to your tenants?
- Please be aware that the Temporary Pool Rules (June 2020) allow reservations up to a week in advance, and the new sign-up sheets are available on Tuesday mornings.
- If YOU RESERVE and cannot use the pool at that time PLEASE cross off your reservation ASAP.
- We have 97 units and only 20 sign-up slots on the weekend. Please be considerate when reserving the pool!
- Reserve only one hour per address per day.
- Part-timers are welcome to have a neighbor reserve for them; just make sure the address is the one for the household actually using the pool.
- If the reserving household elects to have another household join them in the pool area during the reserved time...that is their option.
- As always, children must be accompanied at all times by a

- responsible adult; and pets are not allowed.
- Please be mindful of the time, and leave the pool area promptly at the completion of your hour.
- Remember to remove all of your belongings when you leave!
- A Big Thank You to ALL who have worked together to keep the pool open during this time.

- N.C. Wyeth (painter) was a mail carrier from Fort Defiance, AZ, to Crozier, NM.

Grab and Go Schedule - Aptos

Mon, Tues, Thurs, Fri 1 pm - 5 pm Wed 10 am - 2 pm

- Masks are required for Grab & Go pickup. Social distancing of 6 feet or more is also required. Please do not enter any branch facility if you are sick, have a cough, or have any symptoms of Covid-19.
- You'll need your library card number and PIN/password to check out your items with the self-checkout machines, which will be sanitized regularly.
- You can also download the library's app on Google Play or the Apple App Store and check out your things with your phone! Just search for "Santa Cruz Public Libraries" in the app stores.
- Public restrooms are not available at any branch locations.
