PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The Board continues to evaluate the operational requirements for public venues while under the current county COVID-19 restrictions.

In doing so, we have been in communication with the county health officer for clarification about the prohibited operation of our hot tub. We understand that other counties around us are handling hot tubs differently, so we are asking the county for further clarification.

Also, we are moving to a self-sanitization system of the pool furniture and restrooms. Although the pool area and restrooms will be thoroughly cleaned on Mondays and Fridays by our property manger, Tom, pool users are asked to sanitize the areas you use (e.g., chairs, toilet seats, faucet handles, etc.). Supplies for sanitizing the pool area and restrooms are provided.

The clubhouse will remained closed until further notice with no clubhouse rentals over the holidays (sorry).

We have been asked by owners for clarification on our rules regarding outdoor gas fire pits. We contacted the Aptos/La Selva Fire Protection District to get clarification of the state and county rules. All outdoor fireplaces (this includes fire pits) must be operated in accordance with manufacturers' guidelines regarding necessary setbacks from combustible surroundings. We will update the CDS rules to clarify this issue.

While working through the 2021 budget, the Board continues to discuss the larger expense items, including earthquake insurance. The annualized premium of our earthquake insurance in 2020 was over \$41,000. Earthquake insurance is currently our fourth largest operating expense and accounts for over 10 percent of our overall expenses. 
SPA AND CLUBHOUSE CLOSED until further notice

SWIMMING POOL IS OPEN BY SIGN-UP

The pool is open, but you must reserve your time slot (due to Covid-19). Sign up on the sheet next to the pool and reserve on an hourly basis.

- Owners...have you provided the Temporary Pool Rules to your tenants?
- Please be aware that the Temporary Pool Rules (June 2020) allow reservations up to a week in advance, and the new sign-up sheets are available on Tuesday mornings.
- IF YOU RESERVE and cannot use the pool at that time PLEASE cross off your reservation ASAP.
- We have 97 units and only 20 sign-up slots on the weekend.
 Please be considerate when reserving the pool!
- Reserve only one hour per address per day.

- Part-timers are welcome to have a neighbor reserve for them; just make sure the address is the one for the household actually using the pool.
- If the reserving household elects to have another household join them in the pool area during the reserved time...that is their option.
- As always, children must be accompanied at all times by a responsible adult; and pets are not allowed.
- Please be mindful of the time, and leave the pool area promptly at the completion of your hour.
- Remember to remove all of your belongings when you leave!
- A Big Thank You to ALL who have worked together to keep the pool open during this time.




BINGE-WORTHY TV



RECIPE CORNER

Curried Butternut Squash & Apple Soup; serves 6

This butternut squash and apple soup recipe is brimming with warm and cozy flavors of fall (thanks to a delightful kick from the curry). It also delivers 25 percent of your daily fiber and is chock-full of potassium, a nutrient that many of us fall short on regularly. Streamline the prep for this recipe and pick up pre-cut butternut squash: you'll need 7 to 8 cups. Round out your meal by serving this easy soup alongside a salad or sandwich.

Ingredients

- 1 tablespoon unsalted butter
 1 tablespoon olive oil
 2 cups chopped sweet onion
 (1 medium onion)
 ½ cup chopped celery (2 stalks)
 ½ cup chopped carrots (3 medium)
 1 tablespoon curry powder
 3 pounds butternut squash, peeled, seeded and chopped (7-8 cups)
 1 ¼ teaspoons kosher salt
 1 teaspoon black pepper
- 2 cups finely chopped Golden Delicious apple (about 1 large) 2 cups unsalted chicken stock 2 cups water
- 6 tablespoons crème fraîche

Directions

Step 1 - Melt butter with olive oil in a large pot over medium. Add onion, celery and carrots and stir to coat. Cook, stirring occasionally, until vegetables are tender, 8 to 10 minutes. Add curry powder; stir vegetables to coat thoroughly.

Step 2 - Add squash, salt, pepper and 1 1/2 cups of the chopped apple to pot and stir to coat. Stir in chicken stock and water and bring to a boil over medium-high. Reduce heat to low, cover and cook, stirring occasionally, until butternut squash is soft when pierced with a fork, 20 to 25 minutes.

Step 3 - Remove from heat and, working in 2 batches, pour soup into a heavy-duty blender. Secure lid on blender and remove center piece to allow steam to escape. Place a clean towel over opening. Process until smooth, about 1 minute. Return soup to pot; reheat if needed. Serve with crème fraîche and garnish with remaining 1/2 cup chopped apple.
