Emergency Preparedness Training



As part of our Emergency Planning, we are asking residents to sign up for classes being offered by the Santa Cruz County Community Emergency Response Team. The more people who are trained the better, so we can help each other in an emergency. For more information, go to:

The Basic CERT Training Course prepares you to handle disaster situations, at home and in your community. You will learn what to do on your own, and what to do as part of a CERT team. You must attend all of the sessions. When completed, you will receive a Disaster Service Worker badge good for five (5) years.
