### **President's Message**

The Board met earlier this month. This meeting was attended by a number of homeowners who made comments as the Board proceeded through its agenda as well as during the open session at the end of the meeting. Homeowners do not attend our meetings that often, and we appreciate when they do. Going forward, we encourage more homeowner participation at our meetings.

Looking to the future, I was reminded last week that Sand Dollar Beach HOA again will be holding its annual 4th of July party on the street through the gate and down by the beach condos. CDS homeowners are invited to attend. Sand Dollar Beach HOA has been a good partner in the median project and most cooperative in considering other matters of possible joint interest.

Our Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions (CC&Rs) provide that all "Common Area parking spaces shall remain permanently available for guest parking." In response to complaints from a number of homeowners, the Board, at its last meeting, determined to enforce these provisions and homeowners are requested to comply.

Other matters discussed included seal coating our streets, repair of the parking areas, repair of the picket fence along Sand Dollar Drive, parking passes, clubhouse access, clubhouse improvement and use, and an emergency response plan. No action was taken with respect to these other matters.

Finally, I met again with State Parks to discuss restoration of the Manresa Uplands beach stairs. As they have in the past, the local State Parks' District assured me that restoration is in their plans (third on the priority list of the local representatives) with available funds being the limiting factor. The projected cost for the stair restoration exceeds \$300,000. The storm damage at lower Manresa and the damage to the parking area at New Brighton Beach are also on the list.


Milestone Wedding Anniversary for Marilyn and Chuck Hansen (473 Arca Drive)



A new study published in the Journal of the American College of Cardiology found that skipping breakfast may increase your risk for cardiovascular disease, and this is particularly strong for stroke. They followed 6,550 adults ages 65 to 70 for an average of 17 years to draw their conclusions.
