President's Message

It is beginning to look like spring/summer has finally arrived, and we are finished with rain until the fall/ winter. While we will continue to place plants in bare spots and replace dead plants throughout the development, all major landscaping projects planned for early 2019 are completed. The success and longevity of our landscaping is dependent on the irrigation system which is aging and constantly in need of repairs. If you see plants in need of water or faults in the irrigation system in need of attention, please let Scott Thomas (831-722-4048) or me know, so repairs can be made.

In connection with our landscaping, the Board has been asked to reconsider its long-standing policy regarding tree trimming. Landscaping is the responsibility of the Association with homeowners allowed to make changes or additions at their expense when approved in advance by the Association. Tree trimming—that is, the trimming of trees that block views or are otherwise objectionable to a homeowner—is also permitted by the homeowner at the homeowner's expense if approved in advance by the Association. The Board has reconsidered these policies and determined not to make changes at this time.

Individual driveways are common areas, and their repair and maintenance is the responsibility of the Association. Power washing of the driveways has, however, long been deferred to homeowners desiring to undertake such a task with a power washer provided by the Association. The Board has reviewed this policy and has approved the power washing of all driveways in the development at the Association's expense. This will also include paved areas other than driveways in the development. This is a one-time event with no intention to do such power washing in the future; and, hence, there is no change in policy but rather an exception. A motivating factor in the decision is the desire to improve unit appearances and consistency in appearance of our driveways.

You will be given individual notice when your driveway will be washed so automobiles can be moved. Water from each unit will be used on that unit's driveway only, so you may notice a slight increase in your water bill.

Also at its meeting early this month, the Board approved improvements to the Clubhouse, including painting and the replacement of blinds and carpeting. In addition, the Board is taking steps to make the Clubhouse more accessible to members. We will provide more information on these projects as plans are developed. It is our hope that the improvements will be completed by year end.

Finally, I pass on to you an invitation from our neighbors, the Sand Dollar Beach Homeowners Association, to attend their annual Fourth of July party. As you know, we have developed a good working relationship with Sand Dollar recently as a result of the median project and other matters of mutual interest. For more information about this event, including time and place, see the invitation itself, which is appended to this newsletter.

Restaurant Review

Jack O'Neil Restaurant and Lounge: Dinner with a Waterfront View by Lorraine Margon

Bruce and I recently had dinner at the newlyremodeled <u>Jack O'Neill Restaurant and Lounge</u>, which is the restaurant in The Dream Inn. It was formerly called Aquarius Restaurant before the makeover, which was completed in mid-February.

The new name reflects the role that Jack O'Neill has played in our surf community; namely, that his company, O'Neill, developed the first neoprene wetsuit. Today O'Neill also encompasses an entire clothing line for men and women as well.

We were there on a Monday evening. It was exceptionally busy. Yet, despite the fairly full house and some additional noise from the lounge, we had no trouble conversing.

We were seated facing the windows, with a view of Cowell Beach. We were promptly offered water and a bread basket. The view was beautiful. We saw the Chardonnay sail in and turn around, and there were plenty of surfers out there hanging ten.



Our server, Brittani, told us about the specials and the soup du jour, and overall was a delightful young woman who was both attentive and friendly. In fact, we found the staff to be much friendlier, while still being professional, than had been our experience in the past.

The menu is on the smaller side, so I would urge you to check it out online before you venture here. We did notice that another couple ordered a dish from the bar menu, so you should feel free to ask to see that menu as well.

We found several dishes that we enjoyed and share. We ordered from the *Soups and Shares* portion of the menu, getting the *Mavericks Meatballs*, *Tsunami Prawns* and Seacliff Sprouts.

The meatballs dish was a trio of lamb and ricotta meatballs, with a roasted tomato marinara sauce, Grana Padano cheese, and micro basil. It was very good.

The Brussels sprouts—pan-fried sprouts, pickled onions, garlic, preserved lemons, and balsamic glaze—were tasty but could have been cooked longer as they were just a bit crunchier than they should have been.

To my mind, the prawns were the star of the main meal. The dish included three large prawns, polenta, and a spicy sauce. The sauce added a nice flavor to the polenta, which turned this selection into a stand-out dish, and I'll definitely be going back for it again.

Bruce ordered a cup of their regular soup—their clam and corn chowder—which was quite good (I sampled it and will get my own cup next time). They also offer a daily "special" soup. This night, it was lentil soup. The bread was excellent and included a soft dark roll and a larger seeded whole grain roll. It was accompanied by a garlic butter spread and a large pat of butter with Himalayan salt sprinkled atop. We were offered a second basket; and although very tempted, we refused so we could save room for dessert.

We ordered two cappuccinos which were plenty hot and good. And, for dessert, we opted for the *Jack's molten*, a dark chocolate cake, flowing with warm sea salt caramel and topped with Marianne's vanilla bean ice cream. It was so good that I almost didn't want to drink my cappuccino because I wanted the wonderful taste of this decadent dessert to linger on my taste buds.

An Answer to Why It's So Difficult for Some People to Lose Weight

Two new studies published in late-April confirm that weight control is sometimes the result of DNA, not willpower. People with mutations of the gene MC4R tend to be obese.

Normally when people eat a meal, MC4R is switched on and sends a signal telling people they are full. Then the gene turns itself off. However, some people carry a rare mutation in MC4R that prevents the gene from working. They never get the signal that they are full.
