## **President's Message**

A huge thanks to Pat Vance and John Melo for hosting a successful HOA party at the Clubhouse on July 14. Those who attended from our community (CDS) and the Sand Dollar Beach HOA enjoyed a festive afternoon and good food. The Board of Directors sincerely appreciates the efforts and time Pat and John dedicate to these events. The Board encourages everyone to join these events as they offer a great opportunity to meet and converse with your La Selva neighbors.

It has been almost three years since the Board first determined that the condition of the median on Sand Dollar Drive had an impact on property values within CDS and that improvement of the median would enhance those values. The Board then undertook to work with Sand Dollar Beach HOA to develop and implement an improvement plan. As of this date there has been little visible evidence of progress on the improvement project. I am hopeful that that will change soon. Depending on contractor schedules, you should see positive movement and progress commencing with the removal of the remaining stumps and leveling of some of the existing mounds. A drawing illustrating the ultimate improvement plan is available in our onsite office in the Clubhouse.

The painting project for those units within Section C (i.e., Canon del Sol below Sea Horse and Arca) continues. Eight units have been completed; and six more will be finished this week, leaving five to go. The biggest problem has been the amount of scraping each unit has required in preparation. Given our proximity to the ocean and sometimes foggy and damp atmospheric conditions, peeling paint can be expected. However, the consequences of the moisture coupled with the general aging of exterior walls and siding is something the Board will be looking at when it considers our budgets for next year and future painting projects.

## Road Work is Coming to La Selva

You may have noticed signs along San Andreas Road, indicating some road improvements coming.



Santa Cruz County Measure D funded road repairs will occur on

streets within the central part of La Selva Beach as follows:

It is likely that some of this work will spill onto San Andreas, so be prepared for minor delays. The Dept. of Public Works is asking that the motoring public avoid this area.

More work is planned for La Selva; this is the first set of Measure D funding for year one. The work will begin on/about July 16 and is expected to be completed by the end of fall.

### **Our County Supervisor**

We live in Santa Cruz County's District 2, and our county supervisor is Zach Friend.

## **A Little History**

The original La Selva Beach (along Playa Lane) was founded in 1925 by real estate developer David Batchelor and was then called 'Rob Roy," (a name you can still find on Google maps). Batchelor started it as a retreat with horseback riding, cottages, bath houses, and a private beach. The now-defunct (since 2000) Rob Roy Video Store was the only business in the area to make note of its 'Rob Roy' heritage.

In 1935 the name was changed to La Selva Beach by the new developer, Edward Burghard. The name "La Selva" is Spanish for "the jungle," or, in temperate regions, "the forest." When founded, the small beach community was surrounded by dense conifer woods.

Of course, the boundary lines have since grown and include communities like ours as part of the La Selva Beach designation.



# **Recipe Corner**

The Rob Roy Cocktail was created in 1894 by a bartender at the Waldorf Astoria in Manhattan, New York City.



1 1/2 ounces Scotch whisky
3/4 ounce sweet vermouth
Angostura bitters to taste
Lemon or orange peel, twisted for garnish; or
Maraschino cherry for garnish

Combine ingredients in a mixing glass and fill with ice. Stir well for about 20 seconds; then strain into a chilled cocktail glass. Add garnish.
